

The Neuengamme Concentration Camp Memorial offers students an opportunity to explore its grounds and to discover the changes that happened there in the project day "Looking for Traces".

After the introduction by the Memorial's pedagogue, the students are divided into small groups, shown different historical photos and given a task to find the places in the photos on the Memorial site grounds. Each place represents a topic regarding the history of the camp, and the students are supposed to research given topic using whatever is at their disposal – text boards at the memorial site, the audio-guide, the exhibitions and the Open archive, where they can find more detailed information.

The groups present their findings to each other during the second part of the project day when they are given a guided tour through the Memorial site itself.

The project day ends with a feedback at the House of Remembrance.

This five-hour project day is suitable for active school groups which are used to work on different topics on their own. The project day is moderated by the pedagogue. It involves working on different topics and ends with the students' presentations of the topics in the exhibitions or the grounds of the Memorial.
